

Message from the Prez-

Many people associate the month of May with Memorial Day. Some look forward to the three-day weekend while others are reminded about the loved ones, they've lost due to war. This Memorial Day please take a moment to remember all the fallen soldiers who made the ultimate sacrifice. I would like to share with all of you the story about Ephraim Silcox.

Ephraim was born around 1849, in Antioch, Illinois. He was the son of Elizabeth Brown and William Silcox. When Ephraim was a young boy, his family moved to the Romulus area. Shortly after Ephram's fifteenth birthday, he enlisted in Company L of the 8th Michigan Cavalry. On January 22, 1864, Ephram mustard into the war, he joined the regiment down in Sterling, Kentucky on February 27, 1864. On August 3, 1864, Ephraim was captured on Stoneman's raid to Macon, Georgia. A large portion of the 8th Michigan Cavalry surrendered and were taken down to Andersonville Prisoner of War Camp. Andersonville was a horrible place and most soldiers who were taken there never left. However, when the news that General Sherman captured Atlanta Georgia on September 2, 1864, reached Andersonville, evacuation started almost immediately. The south was worried that Sherman would ride down to Andersonville and release the prisoners, so they decided to move the prisoners to other camps. In the week of September 7, 1864, almost 17,000 prisoners of war would be moved from Andersonville to other camps in the south. Fortunately, Ephraim would be one of the 17,000 men who survived and made it out of Andersonville. More than likely, during the march to one of the surrounding camps, Ephraim perished and died. His remains probably lie in one of the trenches someplace in the south. If you visit the Taylor Township Cemetery, Ephraim has a grave site near his relatives. His death date is listed as August 3, 1864 (date he was captured). I can't help but wonder if his family ever learned the truth about Ephraim's fate. Mary-Johna Wein


